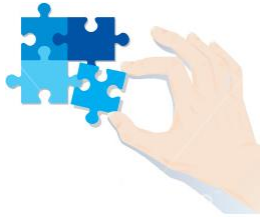

Teacher Tech Tip

Delete 'History' and 'Cookies' - Simple steps to erase your history or cookies:

IE: Click on Tools > Internet Options > (General tab) Browsing History > Delete > OK.

Safari: Click the Safari menu > Preferences > (Security tab) Show Cookies button > Remove All button.

Want to find out the names of the buttons on the toolbars?

Hover the mouse over any button and its name will appear in a box near the mouse pointer.

Adding a toolbar in MS Office XP: Click on View > Toolbars > and click next to the toolbar you want (it will put a '✓' next to the chosen toolbar).
