Security Enhancements

We are excited to share that we have successfully secured grant funding to implement several upgrades which will further strengthen the security infrastructure of our school! These improvements coincide with our recent upgrade of adding security cameras both inside and outside of our building, as well as, implementing a new check-in procedure.

In collaboration with the local police department, we have undertaken a comprehensive review of our security measures and identified areas where we can increase overall safety. Our upgrades include adding another access control panel to ensure only authorized personnel have entry to specific areas, thereby increasing overall control and accountability as well as target hardening of windows and doors per police recommendation.

Our goal is to continue fostering a strong partnership with our local police department to enhance our emergency response procedures and coordination. Furthermore, we express our gratitude for their support and role in helping us secure grant funding. Their commitment to the

safety of our community is truly commendable and we look forward to continuing this collaborative effort. As always, the safety and well-being of our students remain our top priority. It is our goal to keep you informed of the progress of our security initiatives as we move forward.
